Dear Parents/Carers,

This is a brief overview letter explaining what to expect as your child is in Key Stage 2 which consists of Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6.

School bag, home-school diary and daily reading

Please ensure your child brings their red Shankhill book bag to school **every** day. This is very important as children use their book bags everyday to carry books, information and letters to and from home so bags will need to be **checked at home regularly**. The following should remain inside the bag each day:

- **Home-school diary** – two-way communication tool. Please sign the diary after each time your child reads out loud to you, we expect this at least 4 x week and will check each Friday.
- **Learning to read book** – a carefully selected book that your child can read out loud to you each day for at least 10 minutes, at least 4 x week. Please sign the diary after each read. Please encourage your child to read this book carefully so that they can read it fluently and with understanding. This might mean rereading parts. Learning to read books are carefully selected to match your child's reading ability, understanding of vocabulary, language and sentence structures. We use a decimal system called Accelerated Reader so they can choose a book to enjoy reading with ease. They show their understanding of what they have read in the book (comprehension) by completing a quiz. If the quiz score is 80-100% then they move up one decimal book number. This ensures that children are reading books that they understand because they have the required skills to access the words and language.
- **Reading for pleasure book** - a book your child has selected from our school library, the library bus or home to enjoy. This can be changed as often as they like and an Accelerated Reader quiz might be available to help build confidence and wider experiences.
- **Letters, information, visit RSVPs and money** – please check bags regularly and at least once a week to make sure you and your child do not miss anything like a trip or learning experience. Money and RSVPs should be posted into the secure white letterbox found in the main entrance.

Water bottle

All children are given a school water bottle which is kept in school, cleaned each night and filled up with fresh water every morning. Children are encouraged to drink throughout the day to build healthy habits.

Free Fruit Snacks daily

Each day, we provide free fruit snacks at morning break and encourage healthy eating habits.

School lunches

Mrs Hope's school meals are **delicious and unique** in that we can have a **bespoke individual menu** so each child can select their exact meals in advance, meaning you know your child will eat food they enjoy and will be happy.

If you would like to update your child's menu choices, please use the link below and complete by Monday 8 September. Otherwise the current choices will continue for this academic year, unless you request a review.

Meals are now £2.70 each day. You can check if you are eligible for [FREE SCHOOL MEALS](https://forms.gle/ghGj9dDDntTui14B8) and this also provides extra funding for learning and uniform. If your child has any allergies that the school does not already know about please inform the school office.

School uniform

Children should have:

- Red sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
- Blue polo shirt with school logo
- Black or grey trousers or skirt
- Red or blue check summer dress (Summer term)
- Black sensible shoes, including smart black trainers
- A warm waterproof coat with a hood (this can be kept on their school peg).

PE kit:

- Light blue t-shirt with school logo
- Royal blue shorts
- Trainers
- Royal blue PE bag with school logo - PE bags should be left in school for the half term and taken home to wash at half term and end of term.

Please ensure children have black shoes that they are able to take off, put on and fasten themselves (Velcro shoes are ideal). Children are not allowed to wear accessories or earrings.

Please label all your child's uniform and PE kit with their name.

Drop off and pick up

The school gates open at 8.45am and close at 8.50am. Please ensure that you arrive on time. If you are late and the gate is locked please ring the buzzer and someone will come out to let your child in and the staff member will take your child into school. Unfortunately staff are not available to speak to once the gate is closed as teaching and learning begins at 8:50am sharp.

Class 3 children are released from Class 1's door at 3.30pm.

If there are any changes to the usual home time routine, please inform a member of staff directly, and in plenty of time – a voicemail or email may not always be picked up before 3:20pm due to staff teaching.

Class/school events and special learning experiences

Any class or school events will be shared with parents through [SWAY newsletter](#) and events are all published on the [school calendar](#) which can be accessed through the school website. We plan in advance to provide as much notice as possible. However, some opportunities arise or changes beyond our control can happen at short notice. On such occasions, we will inform you directly via email, SWAY and/or Tapestry with as much notice as possible.

Breakfast Club and After School Clubs

We offer wrap around care for all ages of our pupils.

Breakfast Club runs from 7:45am until 8:45am when school starts. We provide a nutritious breakfast and drinks, along with safe and appropriate childcare. Each session costs £4.00 per child.

We offer a range of different fun activities throughout the year at our after school extra-curricular clubs: some clubs are sporty, some are arty and some are messy! Others can be a right performance! Clubs run 3:30 – 4:30pm Monday to Thursday, and until 4pm on Friday. Costs vary depending on the club with pricing based around £2/hr which is extremely good value for money.

There is now a **Stay Late and Play Club** running until 5:30pm for those who require additional wrap around care.

Bookings are made through the school office via a google form link (see below) where you can book for the half term. Payments are made in advance. We accept one-off bookings if made before 3:30pm the day before. Emergency bookings might be possible by emailing head@shankhill.cumbria.sch.uk

Attendance
